

## S(P)EEDKITS – Status of kits

In the table we give an overview of the current status of the kits developed in S(P)EEDKITS.

Kit	Current TRL	Status
Clever Roof	7	Commercialisation being evaluated (Sioen, BE)
Cocoon	7	Commercialisation being evaluated (Sioen, BE)
Multipurpose unit	9	<b>Commercialised</b> by FERRINO (IT). Luxemburg Red Cross asked for a quotation to provide about 120 units to face the Migrant crisis in Greece.
Mobile Modular Unit	9	<b>Commercialised</b> by WRG (NL)
Water pouch	7	Further development abandoned due to (cheaper) competing solutions
Jetting kit	9	<b>Commercialised</b> by PRACTICA (NL), solution integrated in the catalogue of Oxfam. Solution has been used in CAR, South Sudan and Liberia
Raised latrine	9	<b>Commercialised</b> by Flexsolutions (NL). In April 2016, 300 units of Raised Latrine have been purchased by MSF (Nigeria and Iraq), 10 by Norwegian Red Cross, 15 by Oxfam GB. 2 <sup>nd</sup> half of 2016 MSF bought again 8 sets of 4 latrines.
ROM Mobile Desludging device	9	<b>Commercialised</b> by ROM Koks group (NL). In April 2016, ROM has sold 7 units, mainly to the 'regular' market in Malawi as part of WASTE projects but also to Oxfam GB, Médecins Sans Frontières and to The Netherlands Red Cross.
Sludge pasteuriser unit	5	To be further developed.
Water tower kit	9	<b>Commercialised</b> by WRG (NL). Oxfam bought already 2 units and has integrated it in its catalogue of solutions.

Biogas kit	7	Further development is needed and on-going but for non-humanitarian applications.
Shelter socket	9	<b>Commercialised</b> by NRS International as 'Solar Shelter kit', product introduced at AidEx fair (November 2016)
Clearing kit	5	To be further developed.
Debris recuperation kit	8	Being commercialised by De Mobiele Fabriek (NL). Pilot project in Haiti is being worked out.
Rapid deployment field hospital & medical container	6	Being commercialised by Hospitainer (NL). To bring to the market follow up funding is needed. Hospitainer formed a strategic partnership with LOSBERGER (FR) and PHILIPS Healthcare to market this solution.
Medical containers (eg Operation Theatre, Maternity, Dental care)	9	<b>Commercialised</b> by Hospitainer; several units have been sold, e.g. to UNFPA (United Nations Population Fund) for The Philippines after hurricane Haiyan, to MSF for integration on their ship that helps boat refugees in the Mediterranean; also deployed in Sierra Leona (during the Ebola epidemics) and in Syria.
Decision Support Tool	4	To be further developed, to be tuned into the specific needs of a humanitarian organisation before actual use.
Tracking system	6	Partially field tested, to be tuned into the specific needs of a humanitarian organisation before actual use.
